Fourth Sunday Of Lent.

Using saliva and earth, Jesus made a paste to heal the blind man. The healing became a true conversion for the man, but created some problems for Jesus with the Jewish leaders. Because this healing took place on the Sabbath, the Pharisees accused Jesus of breaking Jewish law. The Pharisees tried to get confirmation of this action from the blind man's parents and from the blind man himself. In the end, the authorities were unable to charge Jesus with any wrongdoing and had to recognize that Jesus was gaining many disciples.

Reflection for Families.

In order for parents to help their children follow the light of Christ, they too must open their eyes. As Jesus helped the blind man understand, it is not enough to see only with our eyes. We need also to see with our hearts and allow our every action to reflect this sight. Jesus healed the man of his blindness, but in the end the man recognised Jesus as the Messiah and worshiped him.

Bringing the Gospel into Your Family.

Make an effort today (or sometime this week) to really see God in our lives. This may take some time and deliberation, but take a walk together and look for signs of God in the beauty of nature. Talk about ways God has helped you see with your heart, and suggest ways you can share the sight of your heart with others. You might bring some of your findings to your family's prayer space.

CARE FOR ONE ANOTHER DURING THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC.


Further advice of the Irish Bishops in response to the COVID19 Coronavirus.

The following instructions take into consideration the new norms issued by the Irish government to be in force at present. Bishops are asked to promulgate these instructions in their diocese as soon as possible. These instructions complement the advice issued recently by the Irish Episcopal Conference and remain in place until 29th March. It is likely that these restrictions will continue for some time after that, and instructions regarding the celebration of Holy Week will be issued in due course.

The motivation of these new restrictive measures is a sense of care for the common good and especially for those most vulnerable. Each Christian community should be acutely aware of the responsibility to care for those who are most at risk. For example, even where it may not be appropriate to visit the elderly, a simple telephone call to enquire about their needs could mean so much to them.

NORMS.

- All non-essential pastoral gatherings and meetings, such as formation gathering, retreats and seminars are cancelled.
- All Confirmations are postponed until further notice.
- Every Catholic is entitled to a dignified Christian burial. Attendance at funeral services and Masses should be limited to close relatives and must not exceed 100 attendees within the Church building.
- Similarly, Church weddings and baptisms may be celebrated on condition that the attendance in Church does not exceed 100 people.
- In these difficult and uncertain times, people find strength, consolation and hope in prayer. Churches should remain open for prayer each day.
- In the current emergency situation, all are dispensed from the obligation to physically attend Sunday Mass.
- This is an occasion for all of us - especially in families - to pray more intensely for each other and especially for those who have succumbed to the illness. We should pray also for those in the frontlines - especially doctors, nurses and medical staff and other carers, including clergy - that the Lord will protect them as they place their own wellbeing at risk in the service of all.

Statement from Meeting of Bishop Cullinan and the Senate of Priests of the Diocese of Waterford and Lismore.

*"Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them,
for the LORD your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you."
From the Book of Deuteronomy - 31:6.*

I address these words to you conscious of the current crisis with the spread of the Covid19 virus. I do so in the context of our faith in Jesus Christ. God will not abandon His people. This crisis is a time of testing - the testing of our faith and of our community spirit. Please don't forget to reach out to neighbours who live alone, even a phone call can help. Mindful of the need to care for the body as well as the soul, Masses throughout the diocese will not be cancelled but will take place without the congregation physically present, therefore no public Masses. I wish to draw a distinction between spiritual health and physical health. By congregating large numbers of in a church there may well be a threat of infection and harm to physical health. Your local priest will celebrate daily Mass offering it up for your intentions and indeed for the whole country. Please check our diocesan website for information regarding the various resources you can use each day. In this current emergency situation, all are dispensed from the obligation to physically attend Sunday Mass until and including Sunday, March 29th (this date is under review). Churches will remain open as usual for prayer.

While many are tempted to fear, people of faith can use this crisis to pray and strengthen their relationship with God. Please do not forget our medical personnel who are at the frontline as well as our priests who will continue to minister to the sick and vulnerable.

No matter where you are you can join spiritually with the offering of the priest each day. Below you will find the words of a spiritual communion which you may wish to use. Many parishes have Mass relayed by T.V. or radio and each day I will be posting a reflection and prayer on the diocesan website, which is www.waterfordlismore.ie
